

SYNOPSIS

On the 19th of August 1573 Francesco de Marchi, with a small expedition, climbed the impervious and rocky peak of the Corno Grande, the highest mountain of the Italian Apennine range, accomplishing an epic feat for his time: reaching a peak out of curiosity, climbing what he considered the highest mountain in Italy. He wrote the Chronicle of the climb anticipating by 213 years the ascent of Mont Blanc accomplished by Balmat and Paccard on 8 August 1786, considered the first ascent in the history of mountaineering.

On the 450th anniversary of the feat, the film recounts, narrated in the very words of Francesco De Marchi, the ascent, with a detailed fictional reconstruction, through spectacular images of the climb on the limestone rock of the Corno Grande.

Intertwined with the fiction there is a documentary narrative in which experts and connoisseurs of the feat, such as Vincenzo Brancadoro, historians Stefano Ardito and Roberto Mantovani, mountaineer Hervè Barmasse, geologist Mario Tozzi, speak to us, on the very places of the climb to the summit of Gran Sasso, about the historical figure of De Marchi and the themes he addressed: the ascent and its difficulties, the measurement of the peak and the geography of the places, the state of the Calderone Glacier (the southeast one in Europe), the wool and leather trades that took place between L'Aquila and Teramo, passing through Campo Imperatore.

The absolute protagonist is the Gran Sasso d'Italia, the highest mountain massif in the Apennines.

Francesco De Marchi is the protagonist, together with some Abruzzo mountaineers, of the expedition and author of the Chronicle that testify he was a man of the Renaissance: brilliant, lively, extroverted, traveler and lover of the most varied interests, from military strategy to ancient art.

For over forty years at the service of the Farnese family and Margaret of Austria, in Rome he met and frequented Michelangelo, Bramante, Raphael.



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

Massimo Poggio is an actor. He made his debut in the 90s. His most popular works being L'avvocato delle donne (Rai 2, 1996), with Mariangela Melato, Ama il tuo nemico (Rai 2, 1999). He made his cinema debut in 2000 in Due come noi, non dei migliori, by Stefano Grossi, followed by Rosa e Cornelia, by Giorgio Treves, nominated for a David di Donatello in 2001 andi Nastri d'Argento 2011. In 2003 he worked with Ferzan Özpetek in La finestra di fronte (2003) and two years later in Cuore Sacro.

He is a multi talented actor who has starred on the silver screen, TV series and on Stage.



Hervé Barmasse | alpinista

Athlete, writer, director, and influencer, Hervé Barmasse has always defined alpinism as inspired by respect for the environment and for humankind. Born into a family of four generations of mountain guides, he has linked his name to maiden ascents the world over, which he has often faced solo.

In 2011 he opened up three new routes on Mont Blanc, Mont Rose, and the Matterhorn, thus demonstrating that even in the Alps, there is still more room for adventure.

Climbing his first eight-thousander, Shisha Pangma (8,027 m) in alpine style, he achieved a record time of 13 hours by applying a new – and more scientific – methodology of preparation, training, and nutrition. In December 2021, he attempted a unique feat that had never been tried before: the winter ascent of Nanga Parbat from the Rupal Wall. Only bad weather stopped him...for now.




